



HOW TO SET THE ANGLE OF ATTACK ON A CRAIG ONE WAY PLOW

Craig one way plows have a built in adjustment which allows the operator to adjust the plow for different plowing conditions. Depending on the plow model, there could be one adjustable brace or two. The figures below highlight the location of the adjustable braces and their possible positioning.





Most Craig one way plows have three adjustment holes. Depending on the model of plow, these adjustment holes correspond to a different angle of attack.

Typically the first hole is useful for fall/spring conditions when the roadway may not be frozen solid, as it does not scrape as hard on the roadway. The third hole is normally used for peeling hard packed snow, and will scrape the road much better than the first hole. The tradeoff for plowing in this position is that the plow may have a greater tendency to chatter or hop on the road surface or gouge the roadway if not frozen.
